Bhagat like his earlier novels starts the story of the novel by interacting with Madhav Jha, protagonist of the novel at Chanakya Hotel, Patna. The story of the novel revolves around Madhav Jha, a boy from Dumraon in Bihar and Riya Somani, a girl from New Delhi. Both the characters took admission in the same college in Delhi, become good friends make sex and finally get married. Madhav gets admission in St. Stephens College through sports quota. At the same time Riya also gets admission in the college on the basis of sports quota. On the first sight Madhav falls in love with Riya.

They become friends and used to play basketball in the college. He says, "Yet, it was one of the most beautiful faces I had seen my entire life. Sometimes it is hard to explain why you find a person beautiful. Was it her narrow face, perfectly in line with her slender body? Was it her flawless skin and complexion which had turned from cream to pink to red? Or was it not about her looks at all? Was it her passion, her being totally immersed in the game? I didn't know". He falls in love with her. Every time he used to think about her. He visits her home to see her when she was sick. He becomes jealous when he comes to know that Riya is going to marry with Rohan Chandak, a businessman in London. He feels so humiliated and thinks what his friends will think about him who already advised him to keep distance between her.

He says, "The situation reminded me of what my friends used to tell me. I was induced a toy. I felt like Woody from the movie *Toy Story*. In the film, Woody, a neglected toy, cries alone because his owner grows up and no longer plays with him".

Chetan Bhagat's novels are incomplete without kiss and sex scenes. From the beginning Five Point someone to Room No 105 we see the both the scenes. Once he comes to Patna to meet Samantha, one of the employees at Bill Gates Foundation at Chanakya Hotel. He sees Riya Somani in the hotel who comes to Patna for a work related to her company which she joins after taking divorce from her husband, Rohan Chandak. He feels extremely happy. In his words,
